A MESSAGE FROM OUR BOARD CHAIRMAN AND CEO

Now more than ever before, Tidelands Health is transforming the health of our region.

For more than two years, our heroic team has courageously served on the front lines of the COVID-19 pandemic, battling an unpredictable, highly contagious and often devastating disease.

With advances in treatment, the arrival of the COVID-19 vaccine and relentless vaccination efforts undertaken at Tidelands Health, we now stand on the precipice of a new day.

As we emerge from the shadow of the pandemic, the future is bright. At Tidelands Health, our dedication to our community and the patients we serve remains unwavering. Every day, more than 2,500 Tidelands Health employee, physician and volunteer partners are joined together by a single, shared mission: We help people live better lives through better health.

It's our pursuit of that mission that fueled our comprehensive response to the pandemic, and it's that same pursuit that guides us as we move forward.

In 2021, we announced plans for two additional hospitals to be constructed within the planned Tidelands Health Carolina Bays Hospital in south Horry County. Tidelands Health Extended Care Hospital, which will provide specialized care to medically complex patients, will be the first long-term acute care hospital in our region.

Meanwhile, we are also planning Tidelands Health Rehabilitation

Hospital, the region's third inpatient rehabilitation hospital operated by Tidelands Health and Encompass Health.

Taken together, Tidelands Health Carolina Bays Hospital, Tidelands Health Extended Care Hospital and Tidelands Health Rehabilitation Hospital will add a total of 96 new hospital beds to help meet the health care needs of fast-growing Horry County.

Tidelands Health — already our region's largest health care provider — will become a seven-hospital health system with more than 60 outpatient care locations.

Looking ahead, the number of Tidelands Health outpatient locations, too, is expected to grow as we continue with our plans to increase primary and specialty care services throughout the area.


That growth is not driven by the need to satisfy shareholders, because, as a not-for-profit health system, we have none.

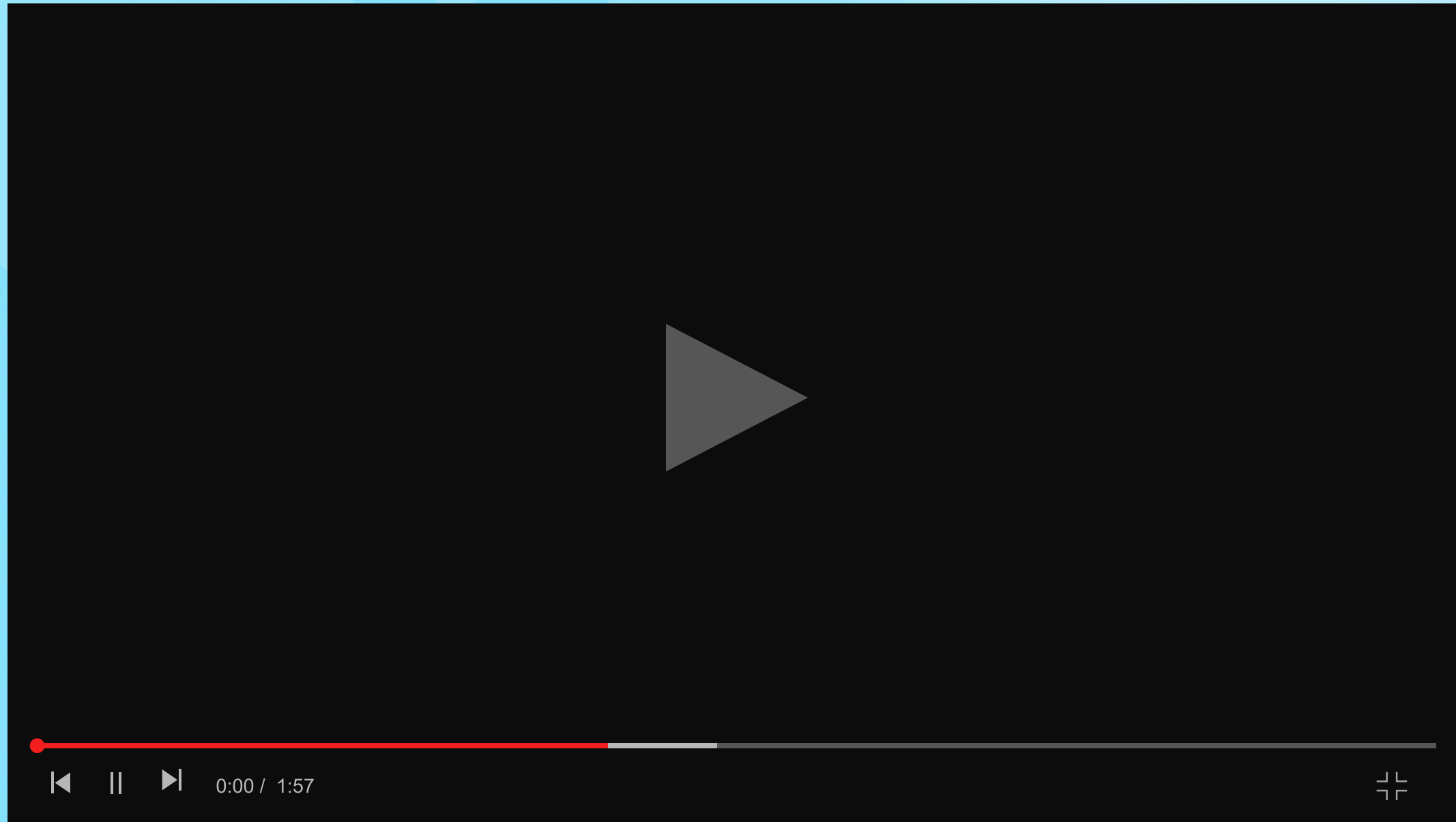

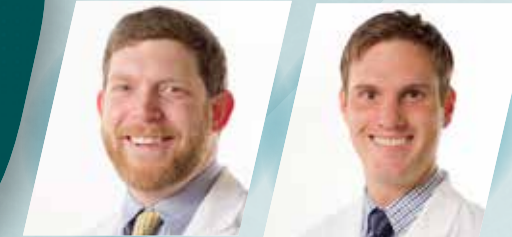

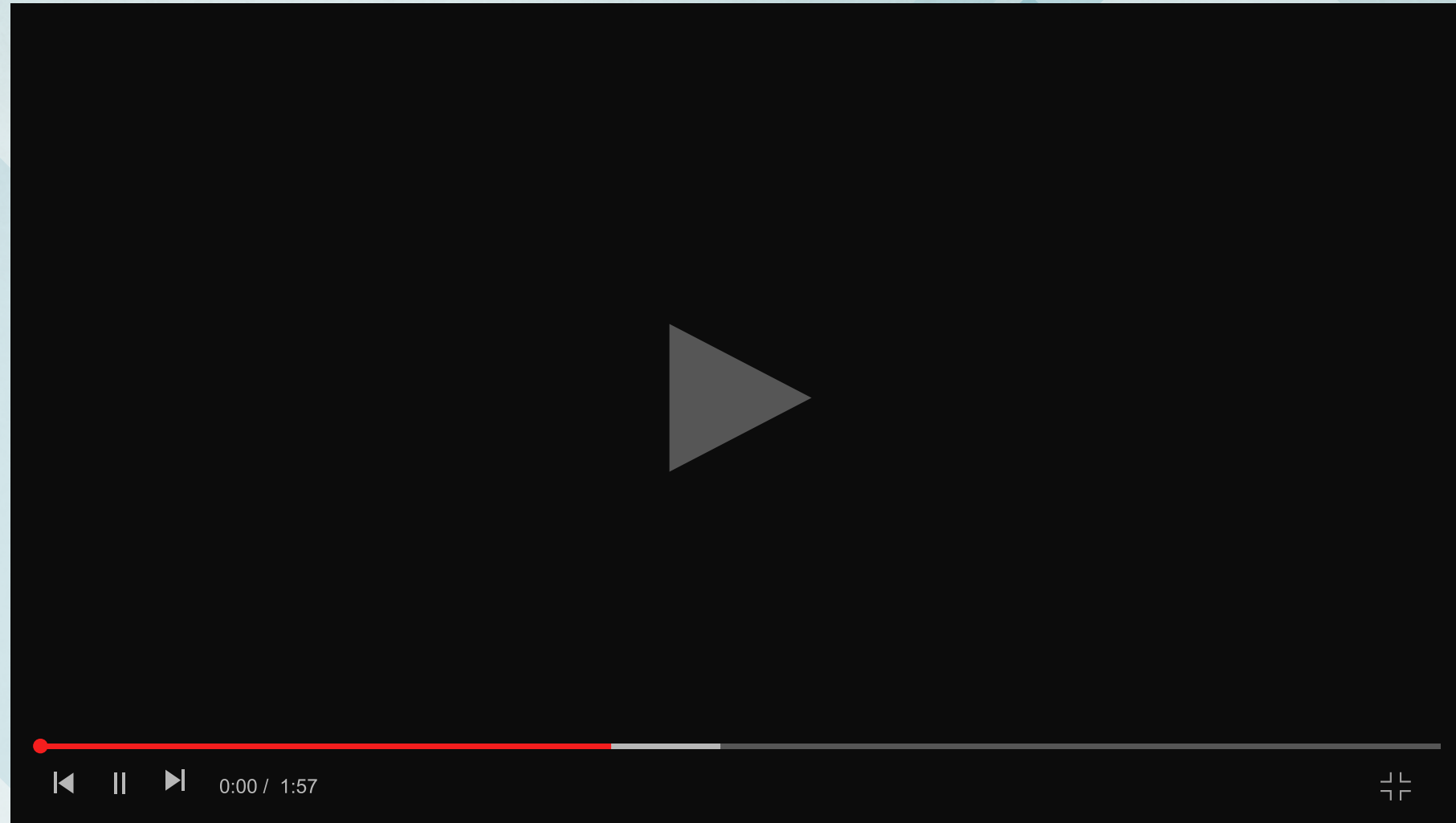
In 2021, three Tidelands Health nurses earned statewide recognition for excellence in their profession.

Mindy Foster, Kristi Jones and Sharon Parrott received Palmetto Gold awards, which are given by the South Carolina Nurses Foundation for excellence in nursing practice and commitment to the nursing profession. Only about 100 nurses throughout South Carolina receive Palmetto Gold awards each year.

Employee and provider partners who have participated in the 101-level offering of the Tidelands Health Leadership Academy, which is offered in partnership with Coastal Carolina University to provide promising employee and physician partners instruction in important disciplines such as strategic planning and project management. A 201-level offering launched in 2021 includes 16 participants.

Scholarships awarded in 2021 to Tidelands Health team members through the McRoy and Jo Skipper Initiative for Learning and Teaching to further their health care education. Funds are raised through the Tidelands Health Foundation and annual Lights of Love campaign.





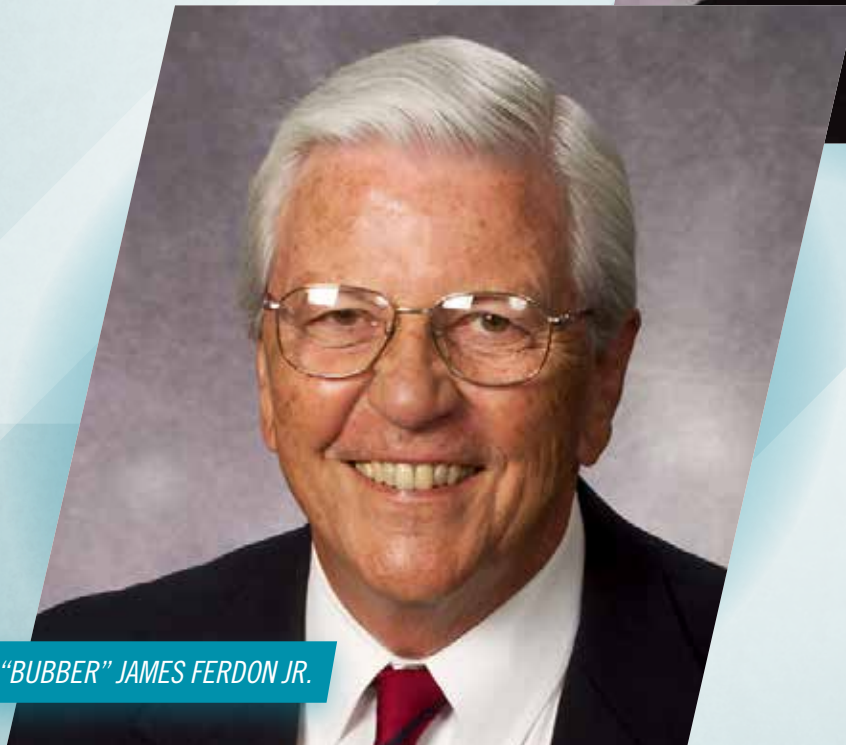

TIDELANDS HEALTH WILL REMAIN FOREVER GRATEFUL FOR THE CONTRIBUTIONS AND DEDICATION OF THE LATE FRANCIS B. "JEEP" FORD SR. AND RICHARD "BUBBER" JAMES FERDON JR., TWO LONGTIME BOARD MEMBERS WHO HELPED TRANSFORM HEALTH CARE IN OUR REGION.

Continuing his father's legacy of service, Ford served on the health system's volunteer board of trustees from 1976 until he retired in 2009, including 25 years as chairman. Ford's father, Albert W. Ford, was commander of the local American Legion Post that in the 1940s initiated plans to build what is now Tideland's Georgetown Memorial Hospital. And his uncle and namesake, Dr. Francis Arthur Bell, was one of the first physicians to practice at the hospital.

Also following in his father's footsteps, Ferdon served for 36 years on the Tideland's Health board of trustees — beginning in 1975 — and served in various board roles, including chairman and secretary, until his retirement in 2011.

Under Ford and Ferdon, Tideland's Health transformed into a regional health system. Their commitment to the provision of high-quality health care for the people of Georgetown and surrounding counties is seen in health care facilities that now dot the landscape.

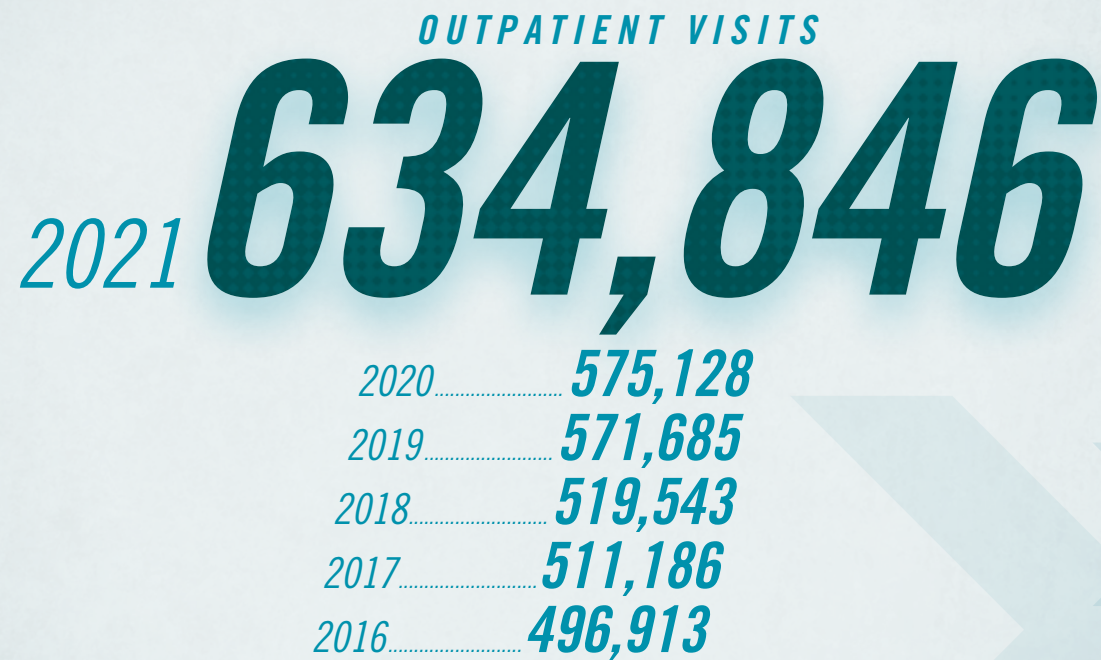

In 2021, Tidelands Health opened a new ambulatory surgery center at Tidelands Health Medical Park at The Market Common, expanding upon the array of services available at the medical park, which also include physician offices, laboratory, rehabilitation, imaging and more.

In partnership with LiveWell Georgetown County and Clemson Cooperative Extension, we launched a program in 2021 to help create on-site gardens at schools and centers by providing all-inclusive kits with the tools needed to get the garden in the ground and help it grow.

The goal? Educate children about healthy eating by providing increased access to fresh fruits and vegetables from their gardens. The program was first accredited by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education in 2016 as it prepared to welcome its first class of residents in July 2017. It has earned accreditation from ACGME annually. To be reaccruited, programs must complete a thorough review and evaluation process by ACGME, which develops its requirements for excellence in clinical learning environments.

As the regional affiliate of MUSC Health, one of the nation's top academic medical centers, Tideland Health offers patients enhanced access to leading medical treatment, including advanced cancer, stroke and vascular care, close to home.

PEOPLE SUFFERING WITH CHRONIC KNEE PAIN NOW HAVE A NEW, MINIMALLY INVASIVE TREATMENT OPTION AT TIDELANDS HEALTH.

Cooled radiofrequency treatment blocks pain signals sent by nerves to the brain. Patients can experience improved mobility and pain relief for up to 12 months.

The treatment seeks to deactivate the nerves that transmit pain signals to the brain. A radiofrequency generator transmits a small current of energy through an insulated electrode or probe inserted into the target area. The energy thermally deactivates the nerves responsible for sending pain signals.

MURRELLS INLET GRANDMOTHER LAUDS COORDINATED CARE FOLLOWING KNEE REPLACEMENT



When cortisone injections for the pain in Mary Hoffman's right knee were no longer effective, the retired administrative assistant from Murrells Inlet decided it was time for knee replacement surgery.

After her successful surgery, which was performed by Tideland's Health orthopedic surgeon Dr. Mark Rowley, Hoffman began physical therapy at Tideland's Health Rehabilitation Services at The Market Common, which is located on the same floor as Dr. Rowley's orthopedics practice.

Hoffman was thankful that she was able to undergo physical therapy in the same state-of-the-art, 65,000-square-foot facility where her orthopedic surgeon provides care. Her story is just one example of the ways that Tideland's Health Medical Park at The Market Common, which brings together a broad array of care under one roof, has transformed health care in the Myrtle Beach area.

THE TIDELANDS HEALTH FOUNDATION WORKS IN PARTNERSHIP WITH TIDELANDS HEALTH TO OFFER NEW TECHNOLOGIES, MODERN FACILITIES AND INCREASED ACCESS TO HEALTH CARE SERVICES IN OUR REGION.
